

Titus 2 Woman

Titus 2:3-5

Titus 2:3-5 outlines the standards for older women in the church, emphasizing reverence, teaching good things, and training younger women in aspects like loving their families, practicing self-control, and managing their homes. These women, through their actions and faithfulness, offer valuable insights and guidance for women seeking to live according to the Titus 2 standards. The Titus 2 mandate isn't confined to age but emphasizes spiritual maturity and the responsibility to mentor younger women. The core of being a "Titus 2 Woman" lies in living out one's faith, serving others, and sharing wisdom and encouragement within the Christian community.

While not explicitly called "Titus 2 Women" in the Bible, several figures demonstrate characteristics aligning with these principles:

- **Anna:** A prophetess who, in her old age, served God with fasting and prayer and shared the news of the Lord with others. (Luke 2:36-38)
- **Tabitha (Dorcas):** Known for her good works and acts of charity, particularly caring for widows. (Acts 9:36-43)
- **Peter's mother-in-law:** After being healed by Jesus, she immediately began to serve Him. (Matthew 8:14-15, Mark 1:29-31, Luke 4:38-39)
- **Abigail:** A wise and skilled woman who managed a large estate and demonstrated courage and integrity, ultimately saving her family and becoming David's wife. (1 Samuel chapter 25)
- **Hannah:** Dedicated her family to serving the Lord, exemplifying the value of devotion and service within the family context. (1 Samuel 1-2)
- **Sarah:** Praised in 1 Peter 3:5-6 for her submission to her husband and trust in the Lord, demonstrating qualities the Titus 2 passage encourages.
- **Ruth:** Submitted to her mother-in-law and exhibited loyalty and a strong work ethic, earning her a respected place in the community and a role in Christ's lineage. (book of Ruth)
- **Naomi:** In the Book of Ruth, Naomi provides guidance and support to her daughter-in-law Ruth, navigating life's challenges, including loss and seeking provision. Ruth observes Naomi's walk with God and demonstrates loyalty by following her to a new land. Naomi's wisdom in guiding Ruth eventually leads to Ruth's marriage to Boaz, ensuring their

well-being and placing them in the lineage of King David. (Book of Ruth)

- **Elizabeth:** As an older, pregnant woman, Elizabeth's encounter with her young relative Mary, who also was pregnant, offers a beautiful example of mutual encouragement and spiritual affirmation. Elizabeth's words affirm Mary's calling, and she provides support and guidance during this unique time. (Luke 1:5-80)
- **Lois:** Timothy's faith is attributed to the influence of his godly mother, Eunice, and grandmother, Lois. Lois's example and instruction from the Scriptures instilled a strong foundation of faith in Timothy from infancy. (2 Timothy 1:5)
- **Deborah:** While not directly mentoring a specific younger woman, Deborah, as a judge and prophetess, led and advised Barak, a leader of the Israelite army. Her counsel was highly valued, and her courage and faith in God were instrumental in their victory. Deborah's example demonstrates the importance of female leadership and guidance. (Judges 4-5)
- **Priscilla:** Priscilla, along with her husband Aquila, demonstrated a mentoring role by teaching Apollos a more accurate understanding of the faith. While the focus is on a man being mentored, Priscilla's involvement highlights that women can teach and lead others in ministry. (Acts 18:1-3, 18-19, 26, Romans 16:3, 1 Corinthians 16:19, 2 Timothy 4:19)

Based on Titus 2:3-5, a Titus 2 woman is called to live a life that reflects godly character and to teach and encourage younger women to do the same. To assess yourself in this role, you can consider the following questions:

Reflecting on your own life:

- **Reverence and Godliness:** Does life reflect respect, honor, and consistency with biblical principles, demonstrating genuine faith in Christ? Do younger women see a consistent Christian lifestyle, or do they see hypocrisy?
- **Speech and Communication:** Is gossip, slander, or malicious talk avoided? Does speech build up and encourage others? Are words used carefully, especially when interacting with a husband, children, or others?
- **Self-Control and Purity:** Is self-control demonstrated in all areas of life, including thoughts, desires, and habits? Are emotions managed well, particularly in challenging situations? Is there purity in thoughts, words, and actions, upholding a high standard of moral conduct?

- **Home and Family:** Is the home managed effectively, making it a place where God is honored? Is there love for a husband and children with selfless, sacrificial love? Is the husband respected and is there a willingness to submit to his leadership in the family? Do actions and priorities reflect the value of family and home life?

Reflecting on interactions with younger women:

- **Teaching and Encouragement:** Is there active teaching of younger women about what is good and encouraging them in their walk with Christ? Is biblical wisdom shared, offering practical guidance based on personal experiences?
- **Availability and Willingness:** Is there availability to younger women, seeking opportunities to connect with them? Is there openness to sharing life, struggles, and what God has taught?
- **Focus of Mentorship:** Is the focus on the key areas mentioned in Titus 2, such as loving husbands and children, practicing self-control and purity, and managing the home? Is teaching grounded in sound doctrine?

Building Relationships: Are genuine relationships fostered with younger women, showing them kindness, generosity, and encouragement? Is there attentive listening and asking questions to understand their needs and challenges?
